### INTRODUCTION The Impact of the pandemic for CSOs

he pandemic of the new coronavirus is yet having consequences in 2021 and making thousands of victims in Brazil and the world. Besides the effects on public health, the disease also impacted the Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), that face enormous challenges with the need for social isolation and loss of budgetary ties. The current situation is particularly critical for the CSOs due to the sudden and substantial loss of sources of income.

From the beginning, CSOs stood out as protagonists in combating the effects of the pandemic, taking the front line in reducing impacts, seeking to meet the most vulnerable populations and their most emergent demands. In addition to being partners of the public power, in the execution of activities in several areas, they cause high social impact in their surroundings.

The MRSOC Platform, as a political articulation dedicated to strengthening the Civil Society Organizations and the environment for its action, also focused its activities and efforts in combating the spread of Covid-19.

In this sense, the platform allocated R\$ 320,000.00 to combat the effects of the pandemic in Brazil and released two calls for proposals in 2021 to support small projects (subgranting approach) in the following axes:

i. Initiatives in response to the effects of the pandemic and social isolation; and,

ii. Strengthening Civil Society through the enabling of the means¬ required for the maintenance of activities;

It should also be noted that the selected projects are inserted in the areas of health, education, social assistance, human rights, culture, environment and promotion of gender equality, which promote a multiplier effect beyond the budgets' nominal economic value. Therefore, they meet the five core points of the MROSC Platform. On the one hand, the **03.2021 Notice** was intended for the exclusive support of State MROSC Platforms with shares of up to R\$ 25,000.00 each, being 10 received proposals and 5 contemplated. The **04.2021 Notice**, on the other hand, was a call to the signatory entities of the Platform for the presentation of projects. In total, 113 proposals were received and 20 actions were approved.

Adapted to the new reality imposed by the pandemic of the new coronavirus, the transfers maintain partnerships, purchase of food, cleaning, hygiene and food products, preparation of printed and digital materials for information, infrastructure and acquisition of equipment.


Consequently, 25 projects were selected in total, from the five regions of Brazil, in the following states: Acre, Amazonas, Bahia, Espírito Santo, Distrito Federal, Maranhão, Mato Grosso do Sul, Pará, Rio de Janeiro, Rio Grande do Sul, São Paulo and Sergipe.

This catalog, organized from the regions, brings a compiled with the description of the actions supported, the main activities, audiences benefited, CSOs involved in the implementation, resources intended for each project and the territorial coverage.

The support is part of the action "Fortalecimento e Regionalização da Plataforma MROSC" (Strengthening and Regionalization of the MROSC Platform), cofinanced by the European Union in Brazil which aims at strengthening the territorial bases of the platform, the implementation of the federative agenda of the MROSC and the improvement of the legal, political and institutional environment for the performance of CSOs.

### **MIDWEST**



Distrito Federal Mato Grosso do Sul





#### DISTRITO FEDERAL MROSC PLATFORM

State: Distrito Federal

Localization: 32 Administrative Regions of Distrito Federal.

Total value: €4,520.80 / R\$25,000.00

**CSOs involved in the execution:** (1) Fundação ESQUEL; (2) PA- SES; (3) Coletivo Motirô; (4) Azulim; (5) FESHOLNA.

**Beneficiaries:** 10 CSOs from various Administrative Regions of the Distrito Federal. In addition, the State Platform will make available registration for other organizations to inform what is needed to continue their actions to combat the effects of Covid-19.

**Description:** The MROSC Distrito Federal Platform will carry out an internet campaign, register donors to receive items of basic needs, being companies or individuals and a group of signatory institutions that are facing Covid-19 with the presentation of actions carried out. The State Platform understands that one of the big bottlenecks of institutions in the territory is the search for donations and their delivery. The action will also support logistics work, through the storage of donations in deposits of strategic organizations in two regions of the DF (Samambaia and Sobradinho) and support through cost and fuel help to the institutions involved in the search and organization of the donations.

#### CLUBE E ESCOLA DE RUGBY SAMAMBAIA



State: Distrito Federal

Localization: State coverage.

Total value: €1,808.14 / R\$10,000.00

**Beneficiaries**: 75 women heads of household, primarily black women, with no income and with more than two dependents, living in regions of social vulnerability.

Description: In order to ensure food of the community, the Samambaia Rugby highlighted in 2020 a fundamental problem: the autonomy of the peripheries. Food baskets that the organization called "Large Food Basket", a new social technology that allows the collection, availability of balance and the assembly of the kits by the family members themselves. In partnership with other organizations, initiatives and community leaders, 75 heads of family will be registered in areas of vulnerability and who have suffered from the aggravation of the Covid-19 crisis throughout the last year. Following this, each family will be able to make their purchases on the platform, independently or with the help of the volunteer team. In any case, family members will have total freedom to assemble the large baskets and compose the kits according to their needs. Finally, deliveries will be directly made in the houses, respecting all the necessary safety and care protocols to prevent the spread of the pandemic. The action will benefit families, as well as a local economic upturn and value the city's businesses affected by the last year crisis. In addition, the process of communication and experience promotes the defense of citizen autonomy.

#### INSTITUTO PARA O BEM VIVER

State: Mato Grosso do Sul

**Localization:** Indigenous communities in urban contexts in the municipality of Aquidauana.

Total value: €1,808.14 / R\$10,000.00

**Beneficiaries:** 73 Indigenous families; 290 of them are Indigenous adults and children.

**Description:** The project will strengthen actions to support Terena Indigenous families in urban contexts. Through the project, the purchase of food will be carried out for the assembly of food baskets that will be headed to Indigenous femaleheaded households without work and in a situation of social vulnerability, in an urban context. and without support due to Covid-19. These women are registered in the Bem Viver Institute and already receive support. The Institute will also promote guidance on personal hygiene care for the non-spread of the Covid-19 virus. The impact will be with the guarantee of the food on the table of the families and with the direct purchase of the products of the workers of family farming, supporting the ones in pandemic time.

#### **BAHIA MROSC PLATFORM**

State: Bahia

Localization: Irecê, Sertão do São Francisco, Remanso and Salvador.

Total value: €4,520.80 / R\$25,000.00

**CSOs involved in the execution:** Executive Coordination of the Bahia Platform: (1) Associação de Moradores do Conjunto Santa Luzia; (2) ELO Ligação e Organização; (3) Instituto Odara; (4) Serviço de Associações e Organizações Populares Rurais; (5) Instituto Vida por Vida; (6) Cipó Comunicação; (7) IRPPA; (8) CECUP.

**Beneficiaries:** 125 families, with the following composition: 125 women, 95 men, 150 children, 70 adolescents, being able to reach Indigenous people and LGBTQIA+.

**Description:** The MROSC Bahia Platform intends to set up a structure of the operational secretariat, through the acquisition of a laptop and a mobile phone with recharging programmed for the execution of the project, being the function exercised by the proposer, which will contribute for a process of dissemination of the actions of the platform. The secretariat will offer support for collegiate coordination at meetings and in monitoring the actions of the Bahia platform. The project will also support the signatories by articulating cooperatives to supply 125 food baskets in the mapped territories. Thus, the Platform will articulate with the CSOs to be benefited the mapping for delivery of the baskets. This action provides local CSOs to continue their humanitarian aid activities, reducing the hunger of the families served and strengthening the institution.



#### ASSOCIAÇÃO INDÍGENA KIRIRI DA ALDEIA PAU FERRO

State: Bahia

**Localization:** Kiriri indigenous territory, in the municipality of Banzaê.

Total value: €1,692.59 / R\$9,360.00

Beneficiaries: 45 Indigenous families.

**Description:** Prevention actions will be organized, mobilization and the creation of strategies that can battle the spread of Covid-19 in the Indigenous territory. The project will stimulate the community to value Indigenous health and traditional knowledge to protect themselves. In this regard, masks will be acquired, food baskets, cleaning and hygiene products, to ensure the isolation of Indigenous people. A commission will also be formed to develop the activities, with the involvement of young people, artisans and zabumba of the village

#### FUNDAÇÃO DE DESENVOLVIMENTO INTEGRADO DO SÃO FRANCISCO -FUNDIFRAN

State: Bahia

**Localization:** Land reform settlement Manoel Dias, municipality of Muquém do São Francisco.

**Total value:** €1,808.14 / R\$10,000.00

**Beneficiaries:** 29 people, members of the Joca Sabores group, which is composed of 20 women and 09 young people between 15 and 25 years, being 06 female and 3 male.

**Description:** The support will be granted to the group Jovens e Mulheres Camponesas em Ação (Joca Sabores), from the Land reform settlement Manoel Dias. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the production of sweets, jellies, sweets, juices, cakes and breads is made in the family grouping and the sale has been carried out online by the young people of the group. The aim of the proposal is to contribute to the family income through the following actions: 1) Acquisition of raw material for the production, which will contribute to keep the group producing, for another 06 months. The funds raised from the sale of the products will be allocated to the Fund (working capital), to keep the kitchen running; 2) Cost aid for Indigenous families with the acquisition of foodstuff, each family will receive, as a cost aid for their production work with the group, a basket with food items for a period of 2 months

#### CENTRO DE ESTUDOS E AÇÃO SOCIAL



State: Bahia

**Localization:** Salvador, South and Northeast region of Bahia.

Total value: €1,808.14 / R\$9,999.00

**Beneficiaries:** 180 families, being 630 people, including the 30 settled and camped families of the Agrarian Reform of the CETA Movement. Of these are 150 women, 150 men and 330 young people, children and adolescents.

**Description:** In this context of food insecurity intensified by the pandemic, which has imposed numerous challenges for popular organizations, this proposal seeks to strengthen a solidarity alliance between the countryside-city, through the acquisition of agroecological baskets produced by families in areas of agrarian reform and food security aid for families organized in urban social movements, which are in the struggle for decent housing. From this web of solidarity, in order to face the pandemic context, this support will contribute to the resistance of the people from the countryside and the city in the territorial defense for the production and reproduction of life. The beneficiary families are in ¬food and nutritional insecurity in peripheral communities of Salvador and will receive baskets of agroecological food produced by the CETA-South Movement. There are 30 rural working families that are producing through the agroecological system in areas of agrarian reform.

#### ASSOCIAÇÃO DOS PRODUTORES REMANESCENTES DO QUILOMBO DE QUEIMADA NOVA



State: Bahia

**Localization:** Municipalities of Capernaum and Jacobina and in the territories Chapada, Irecê, Piemonte, Diamantina; Quilombos de Queimada Nova, Morro do Chapéu and Território de Identidade Chapada Diamantina.

Total value: €1,808.14 / R\$10,000.00

**Beneficiaries:** 85 families of Quilombo de Queimada Nova, which total approximately 300 people, 84 women, 74 men, 55 elderly, 40 adolescents, 35 children and 3 people with disabilities

**Description:** The impacts of the pandemic were tearing for the world's population and, for the black population, they were much more severe. Deaths, unemployment, hunger and families entering the line of extreme poverty have -directly reached the quilombola population that lives in the rural area on the margins of society. Through the project, the CSO will distribute hygiene and cleaning kits to families in Quilombo de Queimada Nova. To enhance the production of cakes and biscuits, there will be the acquisition of inputs to supply the stock. They will be delivered to the women's collective, with guidelines for disposal and hygiene of packaging. For the infrastructure of the Association, It will be acquired a computer with a printer to enable remote work, print of labels for products and other diverse digital services. With this, the Association will be able to provide the products for school meals that by then the women had given up for lack of inputs. The masks of the hygiene kit will also be produced in quilombo, the community will feel well greeted and household income will increase with the sale of the produced products.

#### CENTRAL DAS ORGANIZAÇÕES COMUNITÁRIAS DE MENINO JESUS

State: Bahia

Localization: Candeias, Metropolitan Region of Salvador.

Total value: €1,808.14 / R\$10,000.00

**Beneficiaries:** 100 black families with children, being 60 female and 50 male, 0 to 11 years of age; 40 female and 30 male adolescents, from 11 to 17 years old, 20 elderly; 80 young adults male and 80 female, from 18 to 59 years; 12 male and 8 female quilombolas.

**Description:** The project will strengthen the team and the actions of intervention aimed at helping families in a situation of risk and social vulnerability. These actions seek to meet the needs of least privileged families, composed of adolescents and the elderly, as well as of family nucleus with people with special needs and people in street situation. The emergency action, carried out in conjunction with partners, will reduce hunger, vulnerability, social risk of breaking ties, and strengthen the entity, the management of the organization and the purpose of representing users transparently, with equity and social justice. Developed actions: distribution of food baskets composed of 14 items, personal protection masks and educational brochures with tips for protection and prevention of contamination.





#### INSTITUTO DE AÇÕES SOCIOAMBIENTAIS - INASA

State: Maranhão

**Localization:** Quilombola Soledade Community, in the municipality of Caias.

Total value: €1,542.50 / R\$8,530.00

**Beneficiaries:** 140 people, being 20 homeless people: 06 men and 4 women; 30 families (total of 90 people), being 60 women and 30 men, and of these, 10 elderly people and 30 children, up to 10 years.

Description: The Institute has as a source of resources its own actions, through sustainable workshops and production from recyclable materials. Given the pandemic, there was a reduction in waste consumption and production. The INASA was out of the main raw material. With this resource, INASA will promote social actions, which will ensure the continuation of practices, as well as contribute to the fight against the pandemic of the new coronavirus with public and private agencies. The action will provide greater performance in the community, since INASA is the only socio-environmental entity in the municipality. In addition, it will be distributed ready-made food (take out food), food baskets and protection and hygiene kit. A volunteer from the institute will visit the homes, making the registration according to the municipal protocol of pandemic control and conducting dialogues about the moment. Therefore, the proposed action seeks to impact communities around INASA.

#### PERNAMBUCO MROSC PLATFORM

State: Pernambuco

Localization: National coverage.

Total value: €4,520.80 / R\$25,000.00

**CSOs involved in the execution:** (1) Associação dos Filhos e Amigos de Bezerros - AFAB; (2) APAE Paulista; (3) Consultoria MAIS Social; (4) Centro Sabiá; (5) SERTA; (6) CDC; (7) Cáritas Brasileira Regional Nordeste II.

**Beneficiaries:** 100 representatives of signatory entities with diverse types of audiences: elderly/disabled people, children, adolescents, LGBTQIA+, among others.

**Description:** The project will strengthen the signatory institutions of the MROSC Pernambuco Platform, as well as contribute to the strengthening of other state platforms, mobilizing CSOs about the holding of municipal conferences of the various segments: health, education, social assistance, elderly, people with disabilities, culture and others. The aim is to provide information and strategies necessary for the organized civil society to influence and actively participate in the construction of the Platform in the Multiannual Plans (PPAs) and their interactions with the application of the MROSC in the execution of public policies. In addition, the Coordination of the MROSC Pernambuco Platform will be strengthened with other related agents, such as: Public Administration, Public Prosecutor's Office, Court of Accounts, Accounting Board and OAB. In this way, three thematic webinars will be held with the focus on the MROSC and the PPA and a forum that will gather several actors active in the MROSC agenda with the following theme: Strengthening CSOs and the MROSC Platform in Pernambuco. The project will also strengthen the MROSC Pernambuco Platform through the structuring of the articulation's social networks.











#### ASSOCIAÇÃO DA REDE DE MULHERES PRODUTORAS DO PAJEÚ



State: Pernambuco

**Localization:** Region of the Sertão do Pajeú, with regional coverage, in the following municipalities: Afogados da Ingazeira, in the urban residencial community Laura Ramos; Iguaracy, in the rural community of Caruá; São José do Egito, in the rural communities of Retiro, Curralinho, Açude da Porta and Riachão II; Flores, in the rural communities of Pereiros and Saco do Romão; Carnaíba, in the rural quilombola communities of Abelha and Brejo inside.

Total value: €1,795.66 / R\$9,930.00

**Beneficiaries:** 150 rural women farmers and other women from outlying neighborhoods of the Pajeú, and indirectly an average of 200 children and adolescents and 80 elderlies.

**Description:** Rede de Mulheres Produtoras do Pajeú is constituted as a grassroots association formed by rural farmer women and poor women from urban peripheries of several municipalities in the region. The requested resources will contribute to the continuity of the organization's work and will strengthen the articulation of the institution along with its members and women's groups that are members of the CSO. Hygiene and cleaning kits will be purchased and distributed, which will be delivered to women in related communities. For this delivery logistics will be mobilized partner organizations that also operate in the territory. The Workers' and Rural Workers' Unions of the municipalities are reference points for the farmers and they are also partners in the action. The women beneficiaries of the project participate in the Associação da Rede de Mulheres Produtoras, and, with this, the action will strengthen the organization of women and minimize the impacts generated by the pandemic with the delivery of the kits.

#### GESTOS: SOROPOSITIVIDADE, COMUNICAÇÃO E GÊNERO



State: Pernambuco

Localization: Recife and Metropolitan Region.

Total value: €1,795.66 / R\$9,930.00

**Beneficiaries:** 88 people living with HIV and AIDS, being 27 adult men (gay and heterosexual), 50 adult women, 09 trans women (08 adults and one young woman) and 02 young women.

**Description:** Gestos has been dealing for 28 years with the population that lives with HIV and AIDS in a situation of social, economic vulnerability and that still faces stigma and prejudice, sometimes from the family itself. The support of these resources, at this time, represents ensuring food safety to people who do not have other spaces or social programs that can meet their demands. A population that needs continuous use of medicines to stay alive, but without food will not be able to maintain adherence to the treatment. For Gestos it is essential to ensure food security by having healthy food for people who live with HIV and are in the peripheries in a situation of poverty. The resource made available will be used to ensure food for people living with HIV and AIDS served by Gestos.

#### SERGIPE MROSC PLATFORM



State: Sergipe

**Localization:** Aracaju, Nossa Senhora do Socorro, Poço Redondo and Canindé do São Francisco.

Total value: €4,520.80 / R\$25,000.00

**CSOs involved in the execution:** (1) Centro de Integração Raio de Sol - CIRAS; (2) Centro Dom José Brandão de Castro - CD-JBC; (3) Instituto Nacional de Inclusão Social - INIS.

**Beneficiaries:** 333 people, among them, elderly, adults, children, adolescents and people with disabilities. All in risk and social vulnerability situations.

**Description:** The MROSC Sergipe Platform will support families who are or have already been served by the platform's signatory organizations. Families who have been affected by the pandemic of the new coronavirus or who are in a situation of social vulnerability. Through the delivery of food baskets, the goal is to minimize the effects of the pandemic. The delivery will be based on the survey carried out by said organizations with signatures of receiving lists and photographic records. The action will also provide local trade movement generating income for small traders. The MROSC Sergipe Platform believes that, when the crisis is overcome, the action of organizations and social movements, post-committee, will enable a greater dialogue with society in general, as well as, possible new partnerships of the private sector.









#### ACRE MROSC PLATFORM

State: Acre

Localization: Rio Branco.

Total value: €4,520.80 / R\$25,000.00

**CSOs involved in the execution:** (1) Rede Ecocidadania; (2) Aredacre; (3) Aborda; (4) Agá & Vida; (5) Unisol; (6) Cáritas Diocesana de Rio Branco.

**Beneficiaries:** 200 families, with an average of 1000 people. Of these: 140 women housewives with an average of 3 children per residence; being 80 women solo mothers. In addition, 10 families of migrants with children; 20 families headed by elderlies with children in their homes; 20 LGBTQIA + families and 10 people with disabilities.

**Description:** The flood that hit Acre, the Covid-19 pandemic and dengue fever, brought the need to move away from work activities. The MROSC Acre Platform with the other signatories, in this moment of public calamity, will develop actions for the acquisition and delivery of non-perishable food (200 food baskets) including cleaning products for population in situations of social vulnerability that have not been taken into account with the help of other initiatives. This action will help minimize the suffering of families who are in extreme poverty to have the minimum necessary in this difficult time, generating self-esteem and solidarity action in communities.



#### ASSOCIAÇÃO RIO BRANQUENSE DE DEFICIENTES FÍSICOS - ARDEF

State: Acre

Localization: State and municipal coverage in Rio Branco.

Total value: €1,805.23 / R\$9,982.90

Beneficiaries: 30 families.

**Description:** ARDEF is an association of people with physical disabilities that has objectives aimed at promoting activities and purposes of public and social relevance. Faced with the global health crisis caused by Covid-19, unemployment has increased and families are experiencing difficulties to bring food to the table. Through this project, in partnership with organized civil society, the CSO will seek to avoid the interruption of essential services provided, as it will ensure the basic functioning of the Association and will give conditions to make payments of electricity bills, telephone and internet. In addition, it will acquire equipment that gives conditions to record the activities and participation through social networks. There will be the distribution of food baskets and protection kits, hygiene and cleaning materials.

#### PONTO DE CULTURA CONEXÃO AFRO AMAZONAS

State: Amazonas

Localization: State and national coverage.

Total value: €1,808.14 / R\$10,000.00

**Beneficiaries:** 300 families, mostly made up of women head of household, being 200 women, 420 children and 180 men, between father of family and young black boys and ameríndios. In addition, 20 families of recent Venezuelan immigrants all families headed by women; 15 Indian women, 20 quilombola women.

**Description:** Ponto de cultura will carry out workshop projects with a focus on the elaboration of artistic projects with the aim of preparing the artists in the making of their projects and present proposes for notices. Through the planned activities, it will be available the adaptation for the remote work of the CSO, from the requalification of the team and purchase of equipment for recording studio. With this, it will be possible to carry out lives, video lessons and formation of action groups. As a final product, the project's e-book will be prepared, a 30-minute documentary with a summary and testimonials of the workshops developed in the period. In addition, there will be distribution of food baskets and cleaning and hygiene kits. The project will foster the formation and generation of minimum income, food security, development of culture and creative economy

#### ASSOCIAÇÃO FOLCLÓRICA E CULTURAL COLIBRI DE OUTEIRO

State: Pará

Localization: Ilha de Outeiro.

Total valor: €1,415.10 / R\$7,500.00

Beneficiaries: 50 families, with about 200 people.

**Description:** The Association will buy food baskets to help children, young people and their families, majorly headed by women. Thus, they will have courage to face the Covid-19 pandemic situation. Most of the actions of the association are focused on culture and are totally paralyzed. In total, they will distribute 50 food baskets that will help women and their families to keep themselves, minimizing the situation of hunger. The distribution will be made by mobile phone connection or via text application. The impact of the project results in ensuring adequate food for families, as many are without jobs, without food and in a situation of social vulnerability.

State: Pará

**Localization:** 37 quilombola communities distributed in 08 territories in the municipality of Oriximiná, Western Region of the state of Pará, called Calha Norte.

Total value: €1,790.24 / R\$9,900.00

**Beneficiaries:** 9,500 people, being 5,000 quilombola women and 4,500 quilombola men.

Description: The support granted to ARQMO will benefit all 37 municipalities countries which are unable to leave the territories due to the increased spread of the pandemic at the headquarters of the municipality. The great challenge at this time is to safeguard the health and integrity of the guilombola peoples, avoiding community contagion, as well as guiding them on the risks of contamination and adopting preventive measures in accordance with the health bodies. In this sense, the CSO will make the acquisition of computer equipment to control the actions that are being carried out in quilombola communities: consolidate the database; control the quilombolas that received emergency aid and the two doses of the vaccine; support to quilombola students in the Special Selection Process Quilombola/2021 of the Federal University of Oeste do Pará and the Federal University of Pará; contribute to the administrative work of the association and support through folders, videos, publications in the campaigns to combat Covid-19 in the communities. The impact will be through the activities developed by ARQMO within the guilombola communities, as well as the sharing with the coordinators of the associations of territory, community coordinators and other institutions.



**Beneficiaries:** 64 families will be served, being 47 families of the black population: 28 quilombola families and 19 urban peripheral families, including elderly, women, solo mothers, men, children, young people and people with disabilities. 03 gypsy families, 05 rural families, 03 families with people with disabilities, 06 families of the LGBTQIA+ population.

**Description:** Coletivo was born in 2014 from the reflections of black women, who suffered institutional racism for occupying positions that were once only for white people, in order to overcome, confront and combat all forms of discrimination and inequalities. In this context, the project will strengthen initiatives of the collective during the pandemic and beyond, as it will support people with cancer through donations of food baskets, hygiene kits, children's snack kits, geriatric diapers and supplementary milk. To strengthen the Coletivo, overdue bills will be paid and there will be purchases of a printer to help mothers and children who have virtual classes, do not have internet to search and print the activities. The resource will promote mobilization of proactive engagement, with the leaders, awakening the critical sense for carrying out political incidences, such as strategies to guarantee rights. Each kit will be delivered with two kits: one on facing domestic violence and the other on social control. The goal of humanitarian actions will be to empower communities and make them creative and sustainable



#### ASSOCIAÇÃO EXPERIMENTAL DE MÍDIA COMUNITÁRIA - BEMTV

Localization: Niterói and São Gonçalo

**Total value:** €1,808.14 / R\$10,000.00

**Beneficiaries:** 15 adolescents and young people aged between 16 and 29 years, 8 of whom are female and 7 of whom are male, an active search vacancy for adolescents with disabilities.

Description: Communication is a human right, and the association works to strengthen young people to fight for rights. The circulation of safe information, an issue for every society, gets worse more in the slums, making them more susceptible to fake news or misinformation. The project faces this situation through the training of 15 young communicators who work checking and producing information on health and fundamental rights, working as an organic network of popular communication in the slums of São Gonçalo and serving as a direct channel with the local population. With this resource will be maintained the basic actions with 15 young people working in the Bom Retiro complex in São Gonçalo and communities of Niterói already mobilized, slums with low access to income and little supply of public services. The association will ensure the continuity of the training processes offered in conjunction with teachers of the Institute of Collective Health of the Federal Fluminense University, aiming to broaden health information, especially on the coronavirus, forming young communicators to check and share health information. It is emphasized that the option will be for the monthly stipends and not for the distribution of food baskets, because the association defends autonomy, understanding that the guarantee of food safety needs to be intrinsically articulated with the income guarantee.

**Localization:** Slums of the North Zone, neighborhoods of Acari, Anchieta, Costa Barros, Guadalupe, Honorio Gurgel and Pavuna.

Beneficiaries: 50 women over 15 years of age.

Description: The Educational Institute Araujo Dutra started the work of assistance to children and adolescents in extreme poverty situations, living in the Palmeirinha slum, in the year 2006. When contacting families, the institute came across the reality of young single mothers and elderly women who care for their children and grandchildren. Since then, the CSO seeks to execute the projects with women who act alone as providers and caregivers. Therefore, the Institute will focus on the Food Safety Program with food basket deliveries. It will also be organized and mobilized a core of black women as community leaderships, to receive support in the professional development and strengthen a set of voices to confront violence against women, children, adolescents and the elderly, severe in this moment of social isolation.

**Beneficiaries:** 30 CSOs, groups and/or collectives throughout the national territory


**Description:** Before the pandemic, many CSOs, groups and groups, especially those of community base, had their communication very localized and territorialized; students, then, poorly use the information technologies to communicate with their target audiences. Training brings numerous possibilities to boost the work of the organization: engaging volunteers and donors, amplifying their voices, focusing on public policies through digital marketing strategies, as well as ensuring the contact of the organization with its beneficiaries and strategy public during the pandemic. The action will be aimed at Digital Marketing and Volunteer Management Training with the aim of empowering CSOs, groups and collectives to create their visual identities, digital presence and mobilize volunteers in order to disseminate their cause and achieve greater visibility to qualify the organization's communication actions. This course will be divided into modules for better absorption of information and knowledge. The course will be approximately 30 hours long and will be broadcast online to registered organizations, later made available openly on Casa Hacker's YouTube.

**Localization:** District of Brasilândia, northwest region of the city of São Paulo.

Beneficiaries: 2,000 people directly in 400 families.

**Description:** Instituto Redes articulates the Solidarity Consumption Network that emerged with the aim of supporting the families of the Sustainable Development Project (PDS) Dom Pedro Casaldáliga, in Cajamar, through the farmers of COOPEC Cooperativa Agroecológica São Luiz de Cajamar. The aim is to promote the direct acquisition of natural, agricultural and organic food for distribution to families through the cooperation network formed in peripheral communities. This initiative will promote, in the District of Brasilândia, the face of food and nutritional insecurity through the acquisition of agroecological, organic and artisanal products directly from rural producers, enabling the generation of income and the distribution of food to families, groups and peripheral communities in vulnerable situations. The products offered in these product baskets will complement the other food groups not included in the food baskets already offered/distributed by the partner organizations. In this way, it brings organic and agroecological food to the table of peripheral families, values the work of producers who respect nature, protects ecosystems and brings the fruit of the work of rural families closer to consumers.

**Beneficiaries:** 100 LGBTQIA+ people and/or living with HIV/Aids, prioritizing women and non-white people.

**Description:** LGBTQIA+ populations and living with HIV/Aids are an integral part of the population segments most affected by the Covid-19 pandemic, either from a health perspective or considering the health vulnerability - whether from a material point of view - given the limitations of insertion of these populations in the world of work, especially at this time of closure of commercial establishments and decrease of job vacancies. Considering this scenario, the project will offer material emergency support, legal and psychological assistance, considering the damage of the epidemic not only in the lack of resources for food, but also in mental health and access to social rights of these populations. In addition, SOMOS will expand the service provided from the possibility to offer food baskets and/or hygiene, cleaning and protection kit for those who are hosted. The populations of LGBTQIA+ people and living with HIV/Aids already suffered a process of vulnerability of life, which is accentuated today. The pandemic moment demands that the fight for the rights of these populations turn to subsistence.
